This legislation provides crucial financial aid to students, enabling them to pursue higher education regardless of their financial background.

### **Proportion of Students Receiving Financial Aid:**

UEP has a total of 15,342 officially enrolled students for this semester. Out of these, 15,164 students are qualified to receive financial aid under the provisions of RA 10931.

$$\text{Proportion} = \frac{\text{Number of students receiving financial aid}}{\text{Total number of enrolled students}} \times 100 = 98.84\%$$

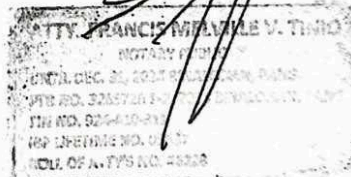
