The University of Eastern Pangasinan (UEP) has specific graduation/completion targets for students who fall into the bottom 20% of household income groups. For the year 2024, UEP proudly reports that 994 graduates are from the bottom 20% of household income groups.

To ensure the effectiveness of its educational programs and support systems, UEP conducts annual tracer studies. These studies track the progress and outcomes of its graduates, particularly focusing on those from disadvantaged backgrounds. The findings consistently highlight the positive impact of UEP's support on these students' lives.

Many graduates have shared testimonials stating that their education at UEP has significantly improved their quality of life. They attribute their academic and professional successes to the opportunities and resources provided by the university, which have empowered them to overcome financial and social barriers.

By setting and achieving these graduation targets, UEP not only supports the educational aspirations of students from low-income families but also contributes to Sustainable Development Goal 1 (No Poverty). Education is a powerful catalyst for socioeconomic mobility, and UEP's efforts ensure that more individuals can break the cycle of poverty and achieve a better future for themselves and their communities.
